

SWIM WITH GIANT CUTTLEFISH

An incredible natural phenomenon puts this historic seaside town on the map. The annual migration of giant Australian cuttlefish between May and August is one of the most spectacular events under the sea and is unique to South Australia. Get up close and personal on a guided snorkelling tour or jump onto a glass bottom boat tour with Cuttys Tours and witness this natural wonder. PORT LINCOLN PRISTINE NATURE, WILDLIFE, AND WORLD-CLASS SEAFOOD

Port Lincoln is the perfect jumping-off point for experiencing the region's many attractions, from pristine beaches, thrilling 4WD adventures and unique wildlife encounters, there's something for everyone. To uncover the many hidden secrets, let a local show you the hot spots: Australian Coastal Safaris, Untamed Escapes and Tour South are the perfect places to start - snorkelling for abalone anyone? Treat yourself to the highest quality seafood with this regional town's impressive dining options. From a unique and mouthwatering fish and chips experience at The Fresh Fish Place to the relaxed vibe at Beer Garden Brewing, coffee and breakfast at Rogue and Rascal, and the crowd pleaser Boston Bay Wines. Be sure to visit Line and Label restaurant, based out of Peter Teakle Wines cellar door for awardwinning food and wine. Head to Mikkira Station Koala Sanctuary for a wildlife encounter on a tranquil and secluded property and camp with koalas.

8 COFFIN BAY: OYSTERS & SEASIDE SCENERY

The beaches throughout Coffin Bay National Park are truly epic and second to none, making this the perfect place to create your coastal adventure! Beach bums take note - Almonta Beach and Avoid Bay should be your first ports of call. While in the area, jump on board an oyster boat to learn about harvesting with Experience Coffin Bay, or wade out into the water, and sit at a semi-submerged deck to sample a few fresh ones with Oyster Farm Tours. If you prefer to stay out of the water, then head over to 1802 Oyster Bar for a great selection of raw and cooked oysters. Discover an unknown slice of Coffin Bay at Yarnbala who offer day and nighttime events that are a stunning collaboration of local bush foods with unique experiences around conservation and sustainability.

9 ELLISTON AREA

ELLISTON VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE

Pack your lunch and go trekking on the 13.6km Elliston Coastal Trail, which reveals some of the most dramatic coastlines the Eyre Peninsula has to offer. Locks Well Beach falls just short of the trail but should be noted as one of Australia's great salmon fishing destinations. Adjacent to the stunning Talia Beach, a walkway provides access onto the rocks to view the magnificent Woolshed Cave, part of the famous Talia Caves. Located at Mortana, and situated between Streaky Bay and Port Kenny, Murphy's Haystacks are ancient and enormous pink granite rock compositions that make for an exceptional stop-off point to take photographs and enjoy the landscape. After all the hiking, drop past the Port Kenny Hotel - a hidden local gem where the seafood is as fresh as it gets. Finally, retreat to a private island nestled in the Investigator Group Marine Park for your chance to exclusively live and feel the freedom of the island lifestyle with Flinders Island Eco Escape.

10 BAIRD BAY EXPERIENCE

This is one very special and remarkable experience and an adventure to write home about! Between September to May, swim side-by-side with the friendly sea lions and bottlenose dolphins as they curiously come out to greet you.

11 STREAKY BAY SEAFOOD

If you love your seafood, then this is the place for you! Purchase everything from Abalone, Spencer Gulf King Prawns, Moreton Bay Bugs, Blue Swimmer Crabs to freshly shucked oysters. The only question is, how will you cook yours? Need a day out of the kitchen? Delight in fish and chips cooked to perfection and served from the food van right in front of the store.

12 CEDUNA ABORIGINAL ARTS & CULTURE CENTRE

Showcasing artwork from more than 130 artists local to the far west coast of South Australia, whose works are strongly influenced by their deep connection to the land.

13 EP CRUISES

Between July to September each year, Fowlers Bay lights up with the magical presence of the southern right whale. Jump on board with EP Cruises for up close interactions with southern right whales, humpback whales, bottlenose and common dolphins, Australian sea lions and long nosed fur seals, incredible bird watching and so much more! Sunrise and sunset guided kayak tours are also available at this time.

14 LAKE MACDONNELL

Discover the jaw-dropping magenta waters of one of South Australia's most photographed pink lakes. Take a scenic flight with Chinta Air to see Mother Nature's full palette on show, caused by the high salt concentration, resulting in some seriously intense pink colours.

15 HEAD OF BIGHT

This is one of the most spectacular whale watching viewpoints in South Australia. From June to October, witness large numbers of southern right whales congregate en masse to give birth to calves in the sheltered waters of the bay at Great Australian Bight Marine Park. Providing a quintessential Australian experience, the Nullarbor Links golf course is a unique attraction to the great Australian drive across the Nullarbor Plain.
